WINTER MANAGEMENT

A reminder that Ashurst Wood has grit salt bins located around the village to be used on pubic pavements and roads, especially at junctions. The grit is *not* for private use. Residents are encouraged to help spread grit salt in areas that need it. In the event of snow, the Council relies on residents to help keep pavements, especially outside their own property, clear in order to help maintain safe pedestrian access.

The Council receives regular complaints from pedestrians who struggle to make their way around the village. Parked cars can obstruct the pavement and force pedestrians into the road. This is dangerous, particularly for blind or partially sighted people, parents with pushchairs, wheelchair users, children and anyone with restricted mobility or other disabilities. Driving on a pavement is illegal, as is causing an obstruction.

You should also avoid parking within 10 metres of a junction as this impairs visibility.

If you own a vehicle and cannot park on your own land then please show consideration to others and do not block access for pedestrians.

OVERGROWN HEDGES and trees are also a hazard which can cause injuries and prevent people from walking on pavements. As a property owner or occupier, you are legally responsible for keeping your hedges and trees cut right back to your boundary and ensuring that no vegetation encroaches onto the public highway (which includes pavements). Please ensure that you do so.
